Greater Everglades Student Memorial Scholarship

Angela Mulligan is the recipient of the 13th annual scholarship for undergraduate studies, administered by the Florida Chapter of The Wildlife Society. A junior at the University of Florida, Angela is pursuing a Bachelor of Science degree in the department of Wildlife Ecology and Conservation. Angela has already accumulated an impressive assortment of professional experience in the field of wildlife ecology, including numerous internships and research assistantships. At the present time, Angela is serving as editor for the student chapter of The Wildlife Society and as a lab assistant while also working towards her degree. Upon graduation, Angela plans to pursue a graduate degree where she intends to continue studying the ecology of coral reefs. Angela's professional aspirations involve conducting research, promoting conservation, and influencing policy.

The FLTWS Student Scholarship was established in 1998 to recognize and financially assist undergraduate students pursuing a career in wildlife biology at a 4-year school in Florida, during their Junior or Senior year. In 2008, the scholarship was renamed the Greater Everglades Student Memorial Scholarship in honor of the 3 FAU students so tragically lost during a wading bird survey that March, and increased from \$1,000 to \$2,000 annually. Applicants for the scholarship are judged on the basis of their financial need, extracurricular activities, demonstrated leadership, professional potential, and personal goals. The Florida Wildlife Federation cosponsors the scholarship. As this year's recipient, Angela Mulligan will receive a check for \$2,000 at the FLTWS Spring Conference.
